Reading Support Program for Students with Disabilities

Questions and Responses:

- 1. Is the district looking for a comprehensive curriculum? Or supplemental? Response: Supplemental.
- 2. Can the district confirm the contract term start and end date?
 - a. 3.6 Contract Completion and Renewal Response: The contract begins upon award, anticipated to be May, 2018 with four one-year extensions.
 - b. This contract shall begin on upon award by the Board of Education, anticipated to be December 2016. The contract may be extended for an additional four (4) one-year periods subject to satisfactory performance and adequate funding. Response: Please see 2.a, above. After award, work will begin with staff to implement in the fall of the upcoming school year.
- 3. Are samples required for this submission (Digital or print)? If yes, can the submission instructions please be provided for those?

 Response: Yes, print samples/examples should be included with appropriate instructions.
- 4. Is the purpose of the RFP truly intended for students with cognitive disabilities? Response: No, it is not for students with cognitive disabilities. This is for students pursuing a diploma.
- 5. And is the scope of work specified final? Response: Yes

- 6. Is there a grade-level priority for the first cohort of teachers to participate in the training and how many teachers are targeted within each grade? For example, would they prioritize grades as follows?
 - 1. Year 1: K-2
 - 2. Year 2: 3-5
 - 3. Year 3: 6-8
 - 4. Year 4: 9-12

Response: We are looking for a program that can range grades 1-12 for Tier 3 only. We are looking to train at least 2 teachers per school for 70 schools. Approximately 20-25 students per school.

7. Is the training for special ed/reading specialists only who work with students with a primary diagnosis of dyslexia (i.e. Tier 2 and Tier 3 students)?

Response: This is for students that are not making progress in Tier 1 and 2 programs. Many will have dyslexia but not all.
