•	• Send out resources available to families/students
•	• More cameras on buses (different contractors) ✓ (*2)
•	• More feedback from students as to ways they would feel safer (*1)
•	• Crisis phone-tree run-throughs
•	• Include lunch/recess monitors in PD @ bullying, crisis management, etc.
•	• Concern about students being dropped off early and unsupervised
•	• Keep building safe with the changes without feeling like a “prison”
•	• More emergency supplies; specifically...a blanket for every child
•	• Identify troubled students ✓ (*2)
•	• Faster removal from the classroom to appropriate alternative ed placement (*1)
•	• Increasing the understanding of normal conflict and bullying (*2)
•	• Need direct instruction on social etiquette – occurs outside of school – comes into buildings (*1)
•	• How to get more stakeholders involved?
•	• Are out-of-school emergency procedures known (field trips, etc.)
•	• More proper funding for mental health programs

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•	• Is there a consistent plan for police support/presence in school communities?
•	• Admin. transparency when events occur and police were involved
•	• Consistent standards and expectations for after-school - Difficulty “reigning in “ bullying behaviors during after School programs
•	• Zoning related to school districts
•	• Aware of cross walks (students crossing where it is convenient) (*1)
•	• More stranger awareness
•	• Security Resource Officer (SRO) in all elementary schools (*1)
•	• Increased awareness against gang activities
•	• Class size (overcrowding) (*1)
•	• Manners/Morals
•	• School system do more research on ant-depressant drugs (*3)
•	• Teachers have an awareness who are on certain prescription drugs
•	• Make sure all visitors are “challenged” at ALL TIMES (show ID, establish purpose for visit, protocol always followed) (*2)
•	• Cyber security/social media (*3) - how do we use it? - monitor it? - checks/balances
•	• Make resources available to parents that don’t know where to go (school, community, etc.) what to do (*4)

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
