•	Include lunch/recess monitors in PD @ bullying, crisis management, etc.
•	Concern about students being dropped off early and unsupervised
•	Keep building safe with the changes without feeling like a "prison"
•	More emergency supplies; specificallya blanket for every child
•	• Identify troubled students $\sqrt{(*2)}$
•	Faster removal from the classroom to appropriate alternative ed placement (*1)
•	Increasing the understanding of normal conflict and bullying (*2)
•	<ul> <li>Need direct instruction on social etiquette – occurs outside of school – comes into buildings (*1)</li> </ul>
•	How to get more stakeholders involved?
•	Are out-of-school emergency procedures known (field trips, etc.)
•	More proper funding for mental health programs
