# 2011 Attendance Area Committee Meeting #5 July 26, 2011

not completed, and is still a work-in-progress. Below is a list of the sending and receiving schools, with the numbers of students moved as of 7/19/11.

## Presentation

Per request from an AAC member at a prior meeting, Mr. Gallihue described the 2012 redistricting plan listed in the Feasibility Study and noted several key points in the plan:

- Balance capacity utilization in the southeastern portion of the county
- Relieve overcapacity in the east with available capacity in the west
- Eliminate an island for Atholton ES if possible
- Maintain walk areas (non-transported areas) if possible

- Redistrict students into schools that are contiguous to their current attendance areas.

Specific Questions were addressed regarding several topics:

- One AAC member raised the concern that the overutilization Laurel Woods ES was only partially resolved in the Feasibility Study.

- Another member noted that, while the number of students moved is low or moderate compared to the total number of students in the county, the percentage of students affected at specific schools is high. Mr. Gallihue noted that there not any specific guidance on the maximum percentage of students in a specific school who are redistricted at once, but there is a transition team made of school based staff that assists the students in the transition. Other members of the committee noted that it may be an asset because the students would be moved once (rather than multiple times over several years) and that the students would be redistricted in a large group so they will be surrounded by more familiar faces.

- A member asked about the restraints that the polygons posed on making redistricting plans. It was noted that this would not be the time to change the polygon lines, but that staff welcomes feedback on specific issues that the polygons create. Mr. Gallihue indicated that the polygons make creating and testing redistricting scenarios more efficient.

# Group Work

Members of the AAC worked in a single group to discuss work on a redistricting plan for the southeastern portion of the county.

- Goal – bring capacity utilization of southeastern schools within acceptable range by using capacity in the west. Use ideas from both plans AAC\_D and AAC\_E.
