Blended Digital Courses

Schedule: M, W, F or T, Th, F 1:30–4 p.m.

HCPSS Blended Digital courses (original credit) offer a hybrid of the traditional face-to-face learning environment and independent online coursework. Students should be independent, competent readers and motivated to learn in alternative formats. Blended courses require students to have reliable access to a computer and internet connection for the duration of the course.

There will be a **MANDATORY orientation on Monday, June 24 at 1:30-4 p.m. at Atholton High School for Blended Digital Courses. Students enrolled in Session II courses only will meet on Monday, July 15 at 1:30-4 p.m.**

Fully Online Digital Courses

Cost: \$550

Dates: June 24–August 2

Two online courses, Modern World History – Honors and US History G/T will be offered.

A MANDATORY orientation will be held on Monday, June 24, 1:30-4 p.m. at Atholton High School. In addition, students will need to take two in-person exams, one midway through the program and one at the end of the program.

Students who register for digital courses will have to complete an online orientation prior to the start of classes, in addition to the in-person orientations at the start of classes.

March 1 – Art, CRD, ESOL, Gear-up for 9th Grade, Lifetime Fitness and Health, and world language

Once a course has opened for registration, it will be available during each subsequent registration period.

All courses will be available for registration after March 1st.

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Summer Institute

Grades K–4

Howard County's Summer Institute Grades K-4 is designed to provide acceleration and enrichment to students entering Grades K-4. In the morning, students take courses in reading and mathematics that provide opportunities for enhancement. The afternoon session offers enrichment opportunities with an emphasis on fun, creativity, expression and exploration in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics), the arts, healthy lifestyles, world languages, and other project- and inquiry-based courses.

Grades 5–9

This program provides extended learning opportunities for Howard County students entering Grades 5–9, who will participate in mathematics, English and – depending on grade level – science or social studies courses. They will have opportunities to participate in a wide range of enrichment experiences such as drama, African American studies, hip hop dance, journalism, art and engineering.
