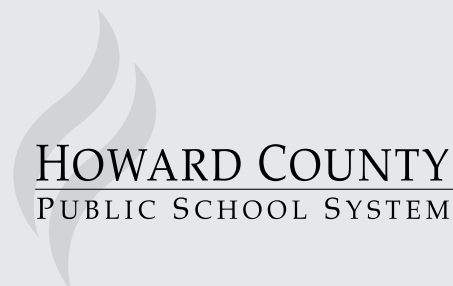

Senior Pass

Enjoy free general admission to athletic contests, student plays and musical performances at Howard County schools. The HCPSS offers a free Senior Pass as a way to say "thank you" to community members 65 years and above. To request your free pass, complete the application form included at the back of this flyer.

Golden Opportunities

Receive convenient information about school system happenings via email. *Golden Opportunities* is a free electronic bulletin containing HCPSS news, announcements of school performances and athletic events, opportunities to volunteer or advocate, and other features of particular interest to the senior community. Registration instructions are provided at the back of this flyer.

Advisory Committees

Provide input on school system policies and programs in your field of expertise or interest as an advisory committee member.

Ad hoc, or short term, committees convene to review proposals and make recommendations to the Board of Education on specific matters such as budget priorities, school construction, attendance areas, the school calendar, and Board policies.

Curriculum Advisory Committees make recommendations about instructional content for a subject area: science, language, math, social studies, and elementary education as well as career academies, school health, and special education.

The *Community Advisory Council (CAC)* serves as a channel for concerns, advice and information from the public to reach the Board of Education.

Notices of committee membership openings are included in *Golden Opportunities* and are posted on the school system website (www.hcpss.org) and in the local media. You may also inquire about the advisory committee for your subject of interest; ask for the appropriate curriculum office at 410-313-6600.

Advocacy

As a representative of a powerful constituency – the senior community – you can add strength to budget proposals, policy changes and other important issues that impact Howard County’s public schools and students. You can show your support through testimony at county budget hearings, letters to the local media, and Board of Education meeting attendance. Advocacy opportunities are posted in *Golden Opportunities*; see the back of this flyer for registration instructions.
