Bollman Bridge is a learning community. Each week, our teams meet with either the Reading or Math Resource staff to learn the latest research-based strategies and techniques. This collaborative professional development and planning process allows our entire staff to work toward common goals in delivering daily instruction. In reading these research-based instructional strategies along with data analysis help in creating a framework for instruction. Instruction is systematic and explicit as we develop readers who can construct meaning in all content areas. Lessons encourage all students to make connections and share openly during class. We are seeing students who are excited to learn and share what they are reading and learning.

In math, our professional development focuses on the Exemplary Mathematical Practices included in the Common Core Mathematics Curriculum. Math instruction incorporates intentional strategies to promote these exemplary mathematical practices within our students. Additionally, our goal is to incorporate open-ended problems that promote students thinking, use of multiple strategies, and to improve their communication skills.

All teams are utilizing an updated school-wide process for data collection and analysis. Teachers are analyzing each student's individualized data and making instructional decisions based on this information. This is allowing teachers to strategically group and instruct students by using both their strengths and areas of need. Our staff is excited to see the academic gains our students are making thus far this school year.

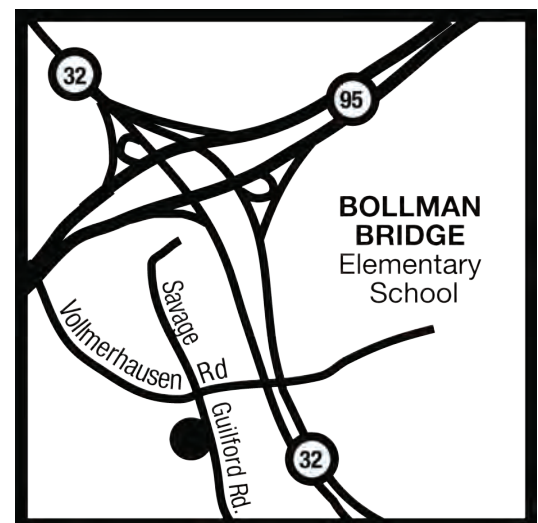

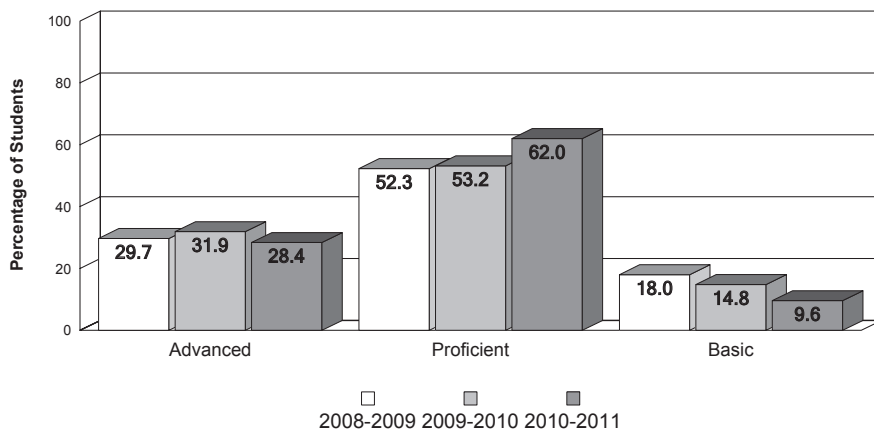

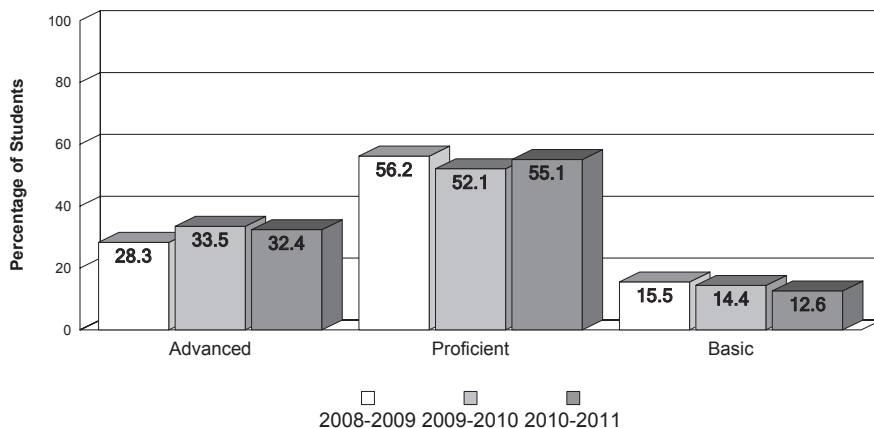
