Deep Run Elementary School opened its doors in 1990. Our staff and community are proud of our commitment of getting to know each of our students as individuals. Our school uses the Developmental Assets model to help create a positive school culture in which students are valued, nurtured, and supported. Our emphasis on assets enhances student achievement, parental support, and encourages collegiality among staff members who are working toward a common goal.

The Deep Run community includes children enrolled in our Early Beginnings Program (birth-age 3), our Regional Early Childhood Program (age 3-5) and all other students through Grade 5. Every effort is made to meet the needs of our students by using brain friendly instruction, conducting monthly No Bullying Lessons for all students, acceleration through the Gifted and Talented Program, and inclusion of students with special needs.

Deep Run is committed to providing each child and family the supports they need for success. With the addition of Title I funds, resources, and teachers to our school this year, we are able to better meet the needs of our students through research-based interventions in Reading and Math. Our Reading and Math Support teachers assist teachers in planning and implementing meaningful instruction based upon students' needs. Our "Ready at Five" grant and our 21st Century Bridges Grant through the Maryland State Department of Education further enable us to connect what we do at school to the very important work that parents do with their children at home.

At Deep Run we are committed to providing a safe and nurturing environment for our children, staff and community. Our school behavior plan (Best on Blue) focuses on celebrating students' good choices and teaching children to respect themselves, others, learning and property. Our school's PTA and business partners are very supportive of students and staff. There are many opportunities for parents to participate in school activities during and after the school day. Our business partners are members of our School Improvement Team and they support our instructional program in a variety of ways. At Deep Run, we work together to as a community to help ensure every student's success.

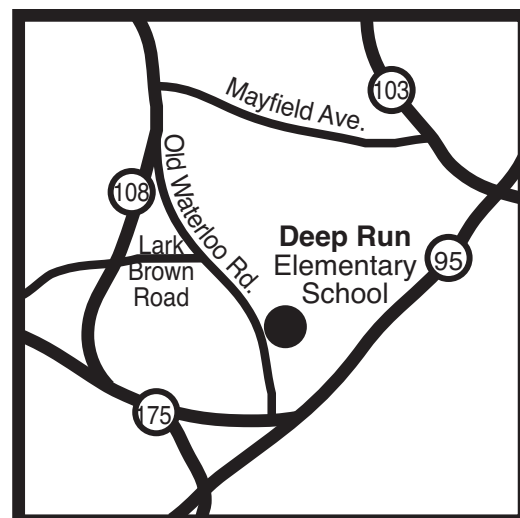

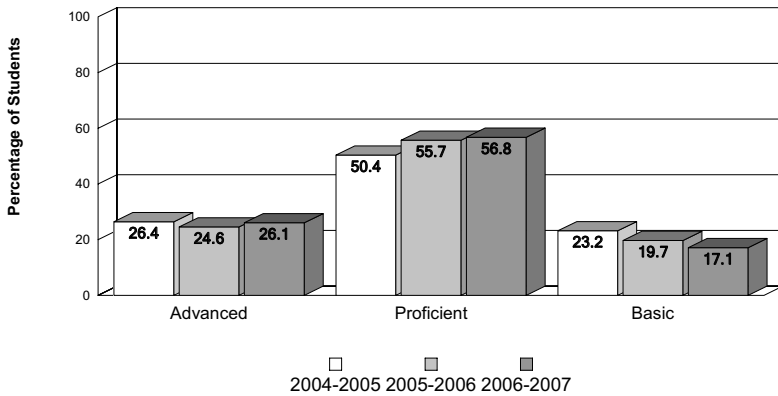

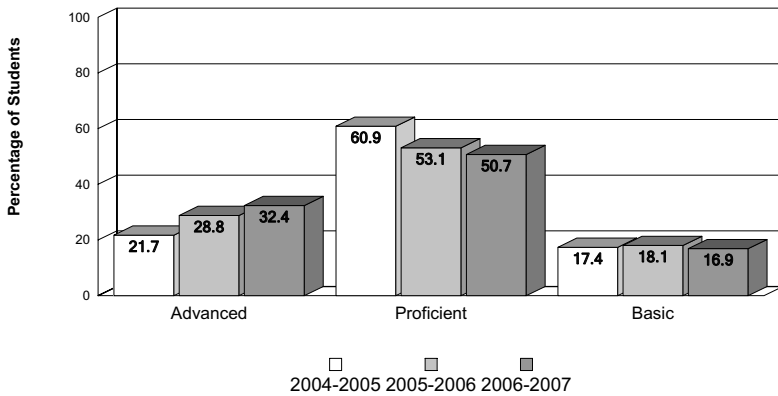
