WORK – LIFE PREPARATION

At every stage of their education, students of the Howard County Public School System (HCPSS) acquire the knowledge, skills, and confidence needed for success throughout life. Preparing students for gainful, satisfying careers is central to the HCPSS mission, "to ensure excellence in teaching and learning so that each student will participate responsibly in a diverse and changing world." Rapid changes in technology, global commerce, and social norms are expected to challenge today's students throughout their lives. Students must prepare for a lifetime of learning and for eventual careers and pursuits which have not yet been identified.

Many experiences in school are designed to help students explore a wide range of interests, discover their unique abilities, and cultivate a love of learning. By nurturing students' passion for subjects that capture their interest, educators help students identify and thrive in a chosen field, and continue to grow in or change careers as they adapt to evolving interests or circumstances.

At the elementary level, career preparation emphasizes skill building and awareness of the world of work. Classroom activities focus on building essential worklife skills such as decision making, cooperation, and conflict resolution. Children begin to identify personal strengths and interests, and learn to balance work and leisure.

At the middle school level, students continue exploring personal interests and abilities, while developing important skills such as goal setting and self-motivation. Classroom activities, field trips, and special programs introduce students to career options in greater depth and offer interaction with professionals from many fields.

For high school students, the emphasis shifts to more focused preparation. Students practice skills such as effective interviewing and planning for the future, while learning to research targeted career and educational opportunities.

THE PARTNERS' ROLE

Community partners play an important role at every step of the career preparation process. At the elementary and middle school levels, representatives from partnership organizations visit classrooms and host field trips. They may work directly with students and teachers to augment classroom lessons with hands-on activities. These interactions help students discover the wonders of many subjects. In the upper grades, students have opportunities to work directly with industry experts. Through in-depth immersion in a subject of interest, these students gain real-world experience that is invaluable in charting a career path and preparing for success later in life.

While partnerships offer priceless experiences for students, they are equally rewarding to the partners. Many professionals from

partnership organizations report immense satisfaction from working with students and nurturing the next generation in the early stages of their careers. In addition, students often ask unconventional questions and bring a fresh perspective that can invigorate a workplace.

The following examples illustrate a few of the many varied partnership activities taking place in Howard County schools that help prepare students to lead productive and rewarding lives.

Howard County Police and the HCPSS partner to provide a Bear Trax outreach program for elementary school students. At Running Brook Elementary School, police officers join club members once a month to enjoy active, fun, and educational activities. Each participant is matched with a police officer mentor who meets with the student weekly for lunch or recess. Howard County Police offers Bear Trax to help children build relationships with positive role models. Bear Trax members learn about the dangers of drugs and alcohol, build self-confidence, and develop mentally and physically. The program teaches children that they have choices and gives them support in making the right ones.

Scientists and other Johns Hopkins University Applied Physics Laboratory (APL) staff join Laurel Woods Elementary students at school twice each month for lunch and conversation. The new "Lunch Time Friends" partnership program provides mentoring, encouragement and academic coaching to students who need extra support. Interacting with professional scientists, engineers, and mathematicians can excite and reinforce students' natural interest in these subjects.

Laurel Woods students also enjoy a similar mentoring program with members of Grace Community Church. Participants from both organizations are invited to take part in enrichment fairs, career days, and other school events.

Many local banks, including The Columbia Bank, Chevy Chase Bank, Howard Bank, Sandy Spring Bank, Bank of America, and Baltimore County Savings Bank, partner with schools to help students learn financial planning and math skills needed for daily life. These dedicated partners offer in-school banking and other activities to stimulate students' interest in money management and enhance their financial literacy. Representatives from the newest HCPSS banking partner, M&T Bank, Clarksville Branch, visit Clarksville Middle School to advise seventh grade math classes on an annual stock market project.

Many other organizations encourage their staff to donate time and talents to enhance student achievement. Honeywell Technology Solutions, Inc. (HTSI), W. R. Grace & Co., and the National Security Agency (NSA) are three dedicated HCPSS partners that give employees time away from their regular responsibilities to volunteer in schools and/or mentor students.

A partnership with Sofiac, Inc., a local custom software development firm, provides Marriotts Ridge High School students and teachers with insights into the latest developments in information technology and computer science. Sofiac representatives collaborate with technology teachers to develop class projects that are relevant to current, real world applications. The company also makes presentations about a variety of information technology and business topics to interested students and school staff.

Howard County General Hospital supports an After School SAT Prep Course focused on opening the door to colleges and scholarship opportunities to many students who might otherwise not prepare or register for the college entrance exam. HCGH sponsorship provides incentives for participants to attend every session – a proven way to boost scores – of the eight-week class series offered at many county high schools each spring. A member of Johns Hopkins Medicine, the hospital has been a dedicated school system partner for more than twenty years, offering student internships in health care and supporting many other educational activities.

Applied Information Technologies, Inc. (AIT), a Columbia-based pioneer in database website technology, has provided internship opportunities for HCPSS students in the Career Academy, GT, and Work Study programs for more than ten years. While learning valuable technical skills, interns learn about working in a business environment and how to communicate effectively within a diverse group of people. In the process, the students find out what they like doing and what they are good at, which helps focus their choice of college major and career with greater confidence. This early professional experience has proven advantageous to many interns in their college and professional careers. For one former AIT intern, the experience helped lead to a high level position at Google just a few years after graduation.

AIT also hosts the HCPSS student scholarship database on their company website, with student interns handling any needed database maintenance and upgrades.

A PROVEN (ROLE) MODEL FOR SUCCESS

Partnerships with several fraternal and other service organizations provide academic and life skills coaching for high school students. Students and mentors get to know each other through tutoring sessions, service projects, and other activities. Often, the mentors

become role models for their protégés, inspiring them to reach for higher goals.

This year, the Columbia Alumnae Chapter of the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority established a Delta Scholars organization at Oakland Mills High School to encourage girls to excel academically, establish a plan to reach career goals, and offer opportunities for leadership through community service. Mentors from the sorority meet regularly with each participating girl to support academic needs and career goals, plan service projects, and enjoy club activities.

A similar partnership between the local Eta Zeta Sigma Graduate Chapter of the national Sigma Gamma Rho **Sorority** and Wilde Lake High School cultivates leadership skills and academic achievement for African American girls. The sorority sponsors a Rhoer Club at the school, where members meet regularly with sisterhood representatives to collaborate on community service projects and school events.

A longstanding partnership with the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity - Kappa Phi Lambda **Chapter** sponsors the Alpha Achievers, an honors organization for high school males of color who demonstrate academic achievement. The organization fosters academic success and leadership qualities while promoting personal responsibility and community service.

Through scholarships and grant incentives, the fraternity encourages the Alpha Achievers to enroll in advanced placement classes, conduct advanced research projects, and attend college. Alpha Achievers was originally established at Oakland Mills High School in 1997;

the fraternity now sponsors groups at Wilde Lake, Reservoir, Long Reach, Howard, and Marriotts Ridge high schools, and plans to expand into additional schools.

Volunteers from Chapelgate Presbyterian Church mentor students in the HCPSS Teen Parenting and Outreach Program. In addition to academic tutoring, the mentors provide a breakfast once each month for students in the program, and offer several annual workshops on skills such as household budgeting.

Younger students benefit from personal encouragement and support provided by local chapters of the **Continental Societies**. The sorority's **Columbia Chapter** partners with the Cradlerock School to sponsor activities in health, education, employment, recreation, and the arts. Society members also provide tutoring, special workshops, and other assistance for students who need

extra academic support. Continental Societies' Southeastern Howard/Laurel

Chapter offers similar support to students at Laurel Woods Elementary, Murray Hill Middle, and Patuxent Valley Middle Schools. The chapter also sponsors after-school debate programs at both middle schools. By promoting student achievement, these partnerships serve the missions of both the schools and the Society, which is dedicated to empowering children to reach their optimal potential.

This spring 131 students participated in the Passport to the Future conference. The program, offered in partnership with the HOWARD COUNTY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, certifies students as ready to work.

FOCUSED IMMERSION THROUGH FIELD EXPERIENCE

Several HCPSS programs give high school students direct experience in the work world and in subject areas of their particular interest. Internships and job experiences enable students to interact with and learn from professionals in the field. These opportunities can help them develop a passion for and knowledge in selected subject areas, while strengthening the workplace skills that are essential for continued success.

GIFTED AND TALENTED INTERN/MENTOR PROGRAM

Many professionals working in organizations throughout the region mentor students one-on-one through a Gifted and Talented (GT) program internship or advanced research project. Under the guidance of a mentor, the student develops an original research study or creative production in an area of their interest. With the goal of contributing to the larger community, students apply knowledge and skills learned in the classroom in a professional environment, either at the mentor site or by consulting with the expert on work done at school.

GT student projects are conducted in a wide array of subject areas, reflecting the range of interests and expertise among students and local professionals. Examples of recent projects include designing, producing, and marketing a specialized line of clothing; researching the psychology of juvenile offenders; creating a program to track and identify ballistic missile flight paths; and designing an architecturally efficient school building.

The collaborative interaction between the student and mentor can be extremely rewarding for both. As a mentor from the University of Maryland School of Medicine expressed, "I experienced great pride in seeing our intern grow into a confident, active, and contributing member of our multidisciplinary team... The time and energy we put into our intern was returned to us ten-fold."

CAREER ACADEMIES

Career Academies, offered through the HCPSS Office of Career and Technology Education (CTE), provide specialized coursework and hands-on experience in a chosen subject area for high school students who plan to major in the field in college or continue in the profession after graduation. By exploring the field in depth, students gain confidence in their career choice while gaining practical skills and contacts that can prove invaluable to future success.

An internship with a professional in the field is an integral element of the career immersion experience. During the internship, the student develops original research, a creative production, or a community-benefit project. Students also maintain a portfolio to document and illustrate their accomplishments.

An Advisory Board for each CTE program area includes industry representatives from local companies and post-secondary institutions. Advisory Boards review curriculum goals and requirements and provide input on technology and career trends.

CRD / PASSPORT TO THE FUTURE

Career Research & Development (CRD) empowers students to discover career interests and explore options for work or higher education. The program is closely aligned with the business community to expose students to many work environments. In the classroom, students learn and practice skills needed on the job, identify interests and aptitudes, and investigate careers and higher education. They meet influential guest speakers, travel to area businesses, and network with professionals in diverse fields. Once prepared, each participant finds employment with a local organization, in a setting related to their career goals, while continuing to receive support and guidance from the CRD teacher. Students who successfully complete the CRD program graduate with three or more college credits.

CRD students may also earn Passport to the Future certification after mastering a variety of essential workplace skills including effective communication, technology applications, and interpersonal relations. The Passport endorses students who seek employment in the region as "workforce ready." Thus, an employer who hires a Passport-certified student can be confident that the new employee has the skills and attitudes needed to succeed on the job. Passport to the Future is offered in partnership with the Howard County Chamber of Commerce, which shares a commitment with the Howard County Public School System to developing of a highly educated and successful workforce.

A BRIDGE TO INDEPENDENCE

Specialized work readiness programs prepare high school age students receiving special education services for successful employment. Work Study, a structured, supervised work experience program, helps students with mild to moderate disabilities develop the skills, habits, and confidence needed to work independently. Work Study teachers in each high school help students identify work interests, set realistic career goals, and obtain a job in the community. The teacher works closely with both student and employer to ensure satisfactory performance on the job.

For students needing more intensive support, Work Enclaves provide a transition step between school and independent work. Small groups of students perform basic, repetitive tasks under the close supervision of special education personnel. Students learn the attitudes and skills needed to work independently, including following directions, completing jobs, and socially appropriate communication. Local organizations enlist the Enclave to perform job tasks such as horticulture, envelope stuffing, collating, folding towels, vacuuming, dusting, bagging groceries, stocking shelves, or constructing and filling boxes.

Employers in both programs enjoy several benefits: continuous support from the teacher in training the employee and monitoring work; reliable attendance, because the school system transports students to their jobs; and the opportunity to identify well qualified candidates for permanent employment after graduation.

Work Study and Enclave employers typically report a high degree of satisfaction with the quality of work. "The Work Study program has provided our foundation with very capable and highly motivated students," according to Don Bard, who has hired several students for the Lazarus Foundation. Employers often share the gratification of helping students enter the productive workforce. As Patricia Laidig, Village Manager for the Town Center Community Organization, stated, "It is a joy having the Enclave students come here weekly to assist us with the variety of tasks. They arrive with broad smiles and ready-to-work attitudes."






