OVERVIEW:

In 2011, more than a quarter of all Howard County Public School System (HCPSS) high school students, and nearly half of all seniors, enrolled in at least one Advanced Placement (AP) course. More than 80 percent of students participating in AP courses also took the corresponding AP exam. HCPSS students took a total of 7,895 AP exams in 2011. Eighty-two percent of these exams were scored 3 or higher, compared to 61 percent in Maryland and 58 percent throughout the nation.

The AP program in HCPSS is a coordinated effort among various curricular programs, student services, and school based staff. It is an integral part of an overall effort to provide students with experiences that help them graduate from HCPSS college and career ready.

Recommendation/Future Direction:

HCPSS schools are making progress in preparing students for college-level work. School staff will continue efforts to identify students with AP potential and to further increase participation and performance levels in all student groups.

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Background

Advanced Placement courses provide the opportunity for students to participate in challenging course work which allows them to fully pursue interest in a particular subject area. HCPSS offers 30 AP courses and 32 exams in the subject areas of art, computer science, English, mathematics, music, science, social studies, and world languages. Each of these curricular areas provides curriculum, common course syllabi, resources, and professional development opportunities for the various courses.

The *Bulletin for AP Students and Parents* published by the College Board, states that participation in the AP Program has three benefits for students:

- Builds confidence in the ability to perform college level work by helping to improve study habits, improve writing skills, and problem-solving ability.
- Provides the potential to enter college having already earned college credit or advanced placement.
- Improves chances for college success since research has shown that AP success typically equates to improving college success.¹

AP exams are administered in the corresponding courses in May of each year. An Advanced Placement (AP) exam is a measure of a student's mastery of college-level studies in specific academic content areas while still in high school. Scores are reported on a scale from 1 to 5 and reflect the degree to which a student may be qualified for college credit or placement. According to the College Board, which owns and administers the AP program, an exam score of 3 or higher is a strong predictor of a student's ability to succeed in college and earn a degree.² Many colleges and universities use AP exam scores to award credit to incoming students and/or place them in higher level courses.

As part of the HCPSS focus on college and career readiness, every sophomore and junior in HCPSS takes the PSAT in the fall of each school year. Schools may then utilize the PSAT AP Potential index to identify students who can be successful in AP courses. In addition, schools hold information nights for parents and students about the AP program offerings. Teachers are also encouraged to "talent-spot" students and to personally invite them to consider AP courses. Schools also have Professional Learning Communities to coordinate school-based efforts to improve AP participation and performance.

The Office of Advanced Programs and G/T provides funding for school based testing coordinators to facilitate AP tests each year. In addition, the Office coordinates the distribution of fee waivers for those families in financial need. Last year, over 400 fee waivers were granted to HCPSS students.

This report provides an overview of AP course and exam participation and AP exam performance among HCPSS high school students in 2011.

AP Course Enrollment

Through AP courses, HCPSS students are able to maximize their educational experiences by participating in rigorous coursework while also engaging in academic practices that will help prepare them for post-secondary education. Over the last five years, AP course enrollment has increased. In 2011, more than a quarter of all high school students and nearly half of all seniors were enrolled in at least one AP course (Table 1).

Among the racial/ethnic student groups, the percent of students enrolled who took AP courses ranged from 12.1 percent among Black or African American students to 40.6 percent among Asian students. More than 80 percent of students enrolled in AP courses took AP exams, with participation rates ranging from 69.7 to 84.9 percent among the racial ethnic groups (Table 2). Due to implementation of new federal race codes in 2011, trend data are not available for each racial/ethnic student group.

AP Exam Participation and Performance

HCPSS students took a record-setting 7,895 AP exams in 2011. The percentage of AP exams taken by HCPSS students that earned scores of 3 or higher (81.5 percent) was 21.3 points greater than the percentage for students in Maryland (60.2 percent) and 23.5 points greater than the percentage for students in the nation (58.0 percent).

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While 81.5 percent of exams taken by HCPSS students earned scores of 3 or higher in 2011, 54.0 percent earned scores of 4 or higher. These percentages have remained relatively steady since 2007.

Table 5 displays the number of students who took an AP exam, the number of exams taken, the percent earning scores of 3 or higher, and the percent earning scores of 4 or higher, disaggregated by racial/ethnic group. The percentage of students scoring 3 or higher ranged from 67.2 percent among Black or African American students to 83.2 percent among White students.

AP Exam Participation and Performance by School

Table 6, below, displays the 2011 AP exam participation and performance by school. River Hill and Centennial had the most test takers with 523 and 443 students participating, respectively. These schools also had the highest number of exams taken, with1200 exams taken at River Hill and 1079 taken at Centennial.

The schools with the highest percentage of exams scored 3 or higher include Centennial (89 percent), Atholton (88 percent), Marriotts Ridge (88 percent), and Mt. Hebron (88 percent).
