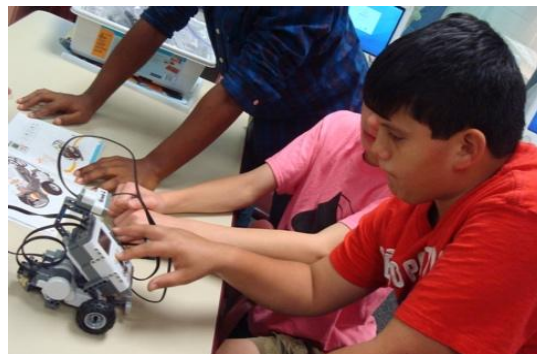

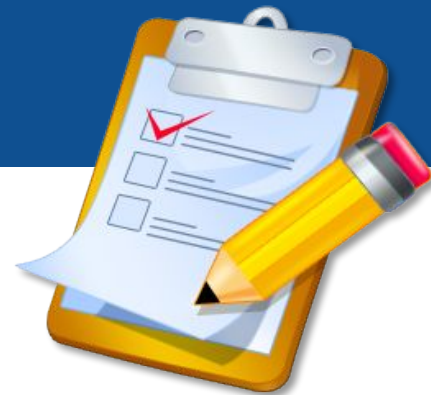

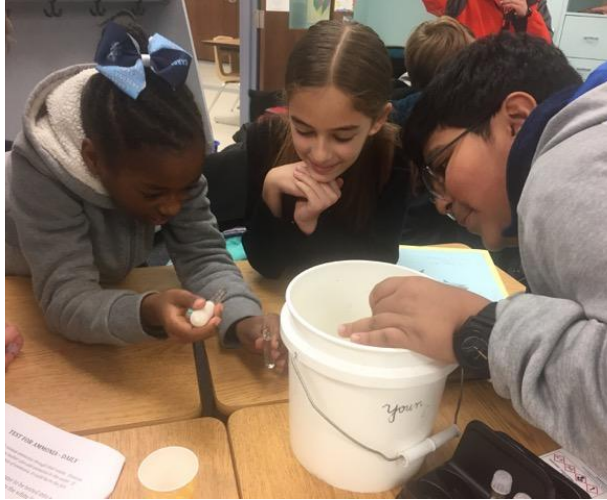

The Gifted and Talented Education Program seeks to recognize and develop talents in all students, including those students already performing at advanced levels.



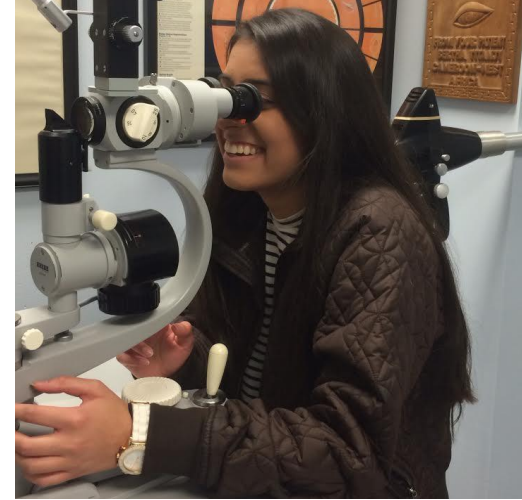

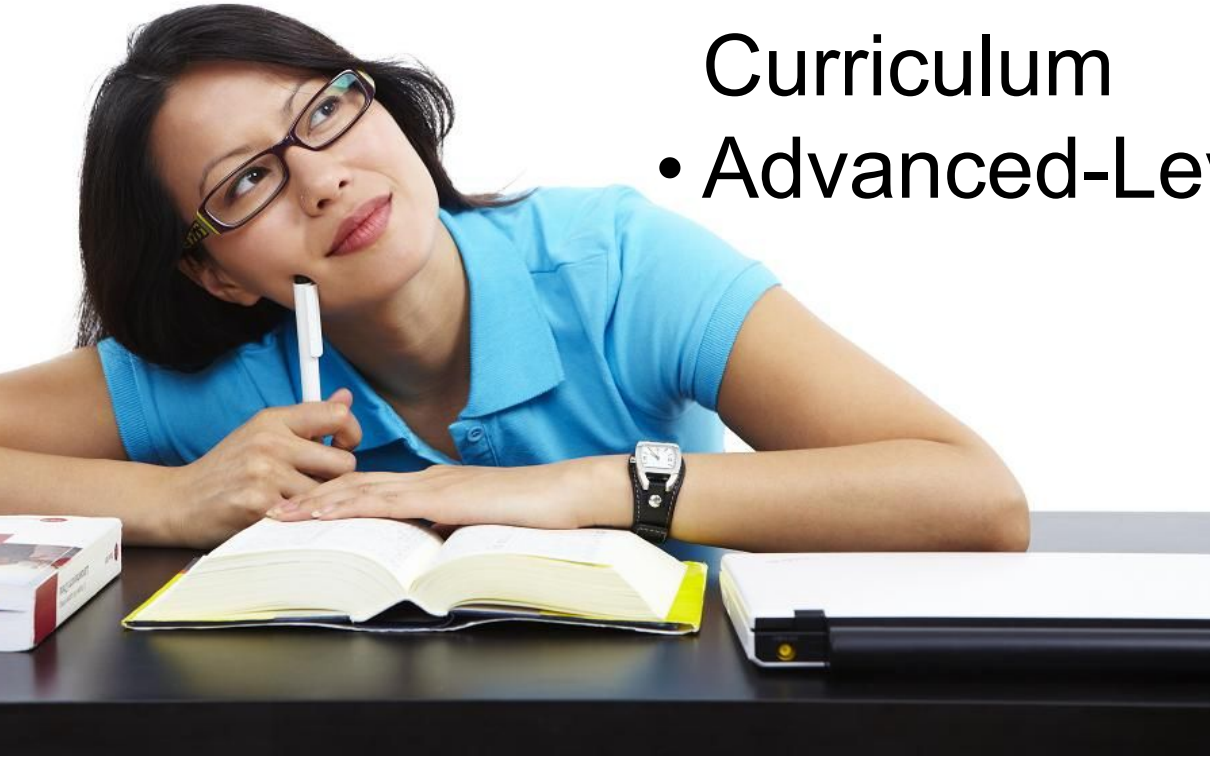

Middle School Course Placement Process


As with elementary G/T Math, the middle school placement process includes...

- ALL students (universal screening)
- Multiple measures (CogAT, MAP, MCAP, class performance)
- Includes an ability measure (CogAT) and achievement measures (MAP, MCAP, class performance)
- Ongoing review of student readiness

Family Input in Placement Process

Families may enroll middle school students in G/T classes via the Course Placement Process via HCPSS Connect if the desired course differs from the school recommendation.
