FRENCH I

Overview. In this unit, students will learn language for talking about things they like and do not like. They will also talk about how often they do an activity and how well they do something.

Essential Questions:

• What do young people like to do in their free time?

- Students in different countries share common experiences outside of school.
- Language has rules, patterns, and structure.
- Language and culture are intertwined.

- Discuss the popularity of comic books with French teens.

- Explain the present tense conjugation of *-er* verbs.
- Explain the use of the verb *aimer* with an infinitive to express preferences.
- Explain the contraction of $\dot{a} + le(s)$ to form au(x).
- Compare the French and English pronunciation of ending consonants and *liaison*.

- Compare places where teens gather to spend free time.
- Compare activities teens like to do in their free time.
- Compare traditional French dances to those in the United States.
