Overview: In this unit, students learn about the country of Guatemala; how they celebrate *la fiesta de quince años*, Day of the Dead, and Independence Day; and how to celebrate other holidays with their friends.

Essential Questions:

- What is *la fiesta de quince años* and how is it celebrated? (Week 1)
- What is The Day of the Dead and how is it observed? (Week 2)
- How does a country celebrate its Independence Day? (Week 3)
- How do you celebrate some holidays with your friends? (Week 4)

Enduring Understandings:

- Guatemala is a country that speaks Spanish.
- Celebrations are an important part the culture of Guatemala.
- Different countries have unique celebrations.
