Phonemic Awareness Activities

Rhyming Game

Ask your child to stand up. Tell him/her that you will be asking a question about a rhyming word, and they need to listen carefully. After you have asked the question they are to point to the body part (see chart) that rhymes with the selected word.

- ❖ Select a word from one of the four groups on the chart below (example: see).
- Create a question using the word (for example, Do you know a word that rhymes with see?").
- Encourage the child to point to the correct body part (for example: knee).
- ❖ Invite them to use the name of the body part in a sentence (for example, "That word is knee.").
- * Repeat with other words.

Sound Separation Activity

- ❖ Give your child a paper cup with 10 edible items raisins, M&M's®, etc.
- Show your child how to count words in a sentence. Demonstrate as you say a sentence in the normal way and then say it again, pausing after each word to take a counter out of your cup and place it on the table.
- Invite your child to copy your actions as you repeat the previous sentence.
- Now say a 3 word sentence and repeat the sequence above.
- ❖ Follow with a 4 word sentence and a 5 word sentence. Remember to model the sentence and invite your child to copy your actions with the identical sentences.
