

Good morning / afternoon / good evening. My name is Bob Cole and I am the Coordinator of Digital Education for HCPSS and I am joined by Dr. Caroline Walker, Executive Director of Program Innovative and Student Well-Being. Welcome to the Digital Education Center **high school** information session webinar. **We are very excited to share this opportunity with you!**

During this session, we will provide information to help you decide if you think the DEC is a good option for your child. The webinar is broken down into three sections with breaks for question and answer throughout and at the end.

First we are going to talk about the overall design of the Digital Education Center.

Next, we will look at high school implementation, including academics, courses, and schedules.

Last, families will learn how to complete the Priority Enrollment form that will be available in Synergy starting tomorrow, Wednesday, April 21st at 4 p.m.

Future Decisions

- The HCPSS Board of Education will make decisions about the 2021-2022 academic school year later this spring
- Final budget decisions will be made at the end of May 2021 to determine program availability and course offerings
- If the budget does not allow for the DEC, students will remain enrolled at their designated home school for 2021-2022

While the DEC is currently in the planning and design phase, we acknowledge that there are still many decisions to make for next school year.

The decision for students to return to in-person, hybrid or virtual learning have not yet been finalized. This information will be shared by the Board as soon as it is available.

Final Board of Education budget approval will take place in May which will determine the final **DEC scope and course options**. If the DEC is not funded, students will remain enrolled in their designated home school.



The DEC program provides an alternate option for students entering grades K-12 who are **not ready or not able to return** to in-person learning, as well as those who have found success during virtual instruction and prefer a virtual instruction model.

The DEC is a **full-time** program and students would be enrolling for the **entire 2021-2022 school year**, with the option to participate in future school years.

DEC students will access real-time, synchronous instruction and complete digital assignments while receiving support services from both the DEC and the student's designated home school.

Comparing the DEC with Other HCPSS Models

Proposed DEC Program (2021-2022)	Current Hybrid Model (2020-2021)	Traditional School Program
Virtual	Hybrid	Face-to-Face
Synchronous virtual instruction and digital assignments; during or outside the school day	Concurrent teaching during the school day (in-person and virtual)	In-person instruction during the school day

How does the DEC compare with other HCPSS instructional models? The main difference is the delivery of instruction which will be a virtual model.

The proposed DEC has real-time, synchronous virtual instruction while the current hybrid model has concurrent teaching where teachers have both inperson **and** virtual students during the school day.

DEC Program and Student's Designated Home

Digital Education Center	Designated Home School
 Receive virtual instruction with a DEC teacher; not the student's current school 	 Participate in extracurriculars (schedule dependent)
 Receive some special education and related services (as needed) 	 Receive some special education and related services (as needed)
 Classes have students from many HCPSS schools 	Access to meals

It is also important to understand that the DEC is an education center but will operate like a school. DEC students will receive their instruction from DEC teachers and receive support services from DEC staff. Students from many HCPSS schools will be enrolled together in the virtual program.

As an education center, students will still maintain a relationship with their designated home school through extracurricular activities, support services as needed, and access to meals.



This week we are offering **level-specific information sessions** April 20th through 22nd which will provide more details about the DEC option.

Once parents/guardians have reviewed all of the information and have determined that the DEC is the best plan for their child, they can submit a priority enrollment form through Synergy starting tomorrow, Wednesday, April 21st, at 4 p.m.

The May 5th priority deadline needs to be early to make sure that our staff have time to start reviewing student course requests, support needs, and potential schedules. We will not meet with families until after the final DEC budget is determined on May 27th. We anticipate meetings with families throughout June and July.

Priority Enrollment Commitment Follow-Up

Before enrolling a student in the DEC, HCPSS staff will...

- 1. Review course requests with the family
- Discuss and review student supports (if applicable)
- 3. Discuss scheduling needs (Will courses be scheduled outside of the school day?)

Completing the priority enrollment form is the first step in committing to the DEC. Once we receive this commitment, we will NOT change your student's current home school assignment for the upcoming school year.

Instead, HCPSS staff will review course requests with our school counselors and present options to each family. We will discuss and review any student supports with case managers that are needed, including special education, 504, EL, and related services. We will also discuss if there are any unique scheduling needs for your child, including if they need to take classes outside of the school day.

Only after we have received a final "sign off" on the student's courses and schedules will we enroll them into the DEC.



Interest Survey Follow-Up

Based on the interest survey we are designing a program to serve students at all grade levels:

Elementary School	650
Middle School	500
High School	500

Final DEC enrollment is based on student commitment and BOE budget approval

In this section, we are going to talk more about the academic program and how to submit the priority enrollment form.

Last week, we collected and reviewed the DEC interest survey data and are designing a program based on those projections. The final DEC program enrollment will be based on the final commitment **and** the Board of Education budget approval on May 27th.



Based on the projections, DEC high school courses will focus on core content classes that meet high school graduation requirements. Electives, acceleration, intervention will be based on the number of students who are requesting, or qualify, for those courses.

In the first year of the DEC, <u>not all high school courses will be available</u>. Therefore, HCPSS staff and will review course requests with the family before moving forward with final enrollment.



Again, high school courses are dependent on the number of student requests. While we will offer core requirements, there will be limited options. For example, the type of world language course will be based on the number of students selecting each world language.

Because transportation is limited, JumpStart and Career and Technical Education programs are limited to HCC-based JumpStart courses and CTE courses that are available in a virtual model. In-person courses that are taught at the ARL may not be available due to scheduling conflicts.



For students interested in taking high school level courses not offered in the DEC, they may schedule HCC JumpStart courses, fully online courses through an MSDE approved vendor, or participate in synchronous instruction outside the school day or in evening.

DEC Schedule Considerations



- After school or evening courses may not allow for some extracurricular activities
- Families can review the schedule before enrolling



The proposed DEC will operate 5 days a week, Monday through Friday, with high school courses available between 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.

For most high school students, classes will be taken during the school day and time will be built in for interventions and services. There are options for students to take classes in the afternoon and evening as needed, but taking courses during these times may limit extracurricular activities.

HCPSS staff will review the student's schedule with their parent/guardian before they are enrolled.

This sample schedule of a typical 10th grade student shows their Monday through Friday schedule of core content classes for graduation as well as student supports.

CTE, English, science, and social studies are taken in a semester schedule with math and world language on a year-long schedule. This student would receive their related services during the day through the DEC or their designated home school.

Although six classes are shown in this example, students will still be able to schedule seven classes each year.

Sample Schedule - High School

Time	Fall Semester Courses	Spring Semester Courses
School Day (8:00-2:30) Includes lunch break	CTE Apprenticesh	nip or Work Study
Extended Day (3:00-4:20)	English 12 (Semester)	Art 1 (Semester)
Evening Period (5:00-6:20)	Advanced Algebra (Year-Long)	

The next sample schedule is for a 12th grade student who has a CTE apprenticeship during the school day, Monday through Friday. This student would be scheduled to take their English graduation requirement on a semester schedule with math on a year-long schedule. An additional Art elective is scheduled in the spring. Because of their morning apprenticeship hours, both of these courses would be taken in the extended day and evening periods.

Scheduling high school students in the extended day or evening periods would be an option to consider based on each student's unique needs.

Instructional Standards

DEC students will be held to the same instructional standards as ALL HCPSS students



DEC students will be held to the same instructional standards as all HCPSS students. They will use Canvas, Google Meet, and approved digital tools appropriate for their grade level.

Students will also be expected to engage with their teachers and other students by attending synchronous classes, completing digital assignments, actively participating in activities, and providing visual cues by using their camera when appropriate.

We also understand parent concerns about screen time. We are working with staff to design instruction that will provide an appropriate balance of online and offline work.



As a new program, it will be important to build community and engage students. Students and parents/guardians will be invited to attend orientation sessions prior to the start of the school year. After the school year begins, the DEC will hold activities that build relationships and promote community within the school. Students will also be recognized for their achievements both during and outside of school. Additionally, students are still encouraged to participate in activities and events, like virtual and in-person field trips, from their designated home school.



Similar to all HCPSS students, DEC students are responsible for taking all assessments. While some local assessments can be taken virtually, others must be taken in-person at the student's designated home school.

DEC staff will coordinate testing dates and instructions with families and the student's home school in advance.





We encourage our students and families to take a moment to reflect on the following statements to see if the Digital Education Center could be a great fit for your children.

Is your child experiencing success academically or does the flexibility and independence of virtual learning meet their needs? Do healthcare concerns make this the best option for your child?

Talk with your student about their experiences this year during virtual learning and use the information provided to help make the best decision possible, with the understanding that not all courses and programs will be available, and that it is a full year commitment.

Completing the Priority Commitment Form in Synergy



The Priority Commitment form is a one-question survey with four acknowledgement statements. Answering this question indicates **a commitment for the 2021-2022 school year** for that child. You will need access to your Synergy account to complete the survey and there are four easy steps.

Again, to complete the Student Interest Form,

- 1. First, log in to <u>HCPSS Connect Synergy</u>
- 2. Second, select More Options from the left panel
- 3. Third, select **Digital Education Center Commitment** from the bottom of the menu, and
- 4. Fourth, complete the single question and the four acknowledgement checkboxes in the form for each child. If you have more than one child, use the dropdown to view each child, choose your option for that child, and then select Submit.

Please contact your school if you require assistance completing the form.

Completing the Priority Commitment Form in Synergy

In committing to the DEC, parents/guardians acknowledge that:

- This is a commitment that your child will attend the DEC for the 2021-2022 school year, and that students will need to go through the reassignment process if they choose to return to their home school for instruction.
- Not all course requests may be able to be honored in the DEC environment.
- There are attendance requirements that will apply in the DEC environment.
- The implementation of the DEC is pending funding from the HCPSS Board of Education. Should funding not be provided, students automatically will be returned to their assigned home school.

- 1. Complete the Priority Enrollment form by May 5th **this is a commitment** that staff will use to develop a schedule for the 2021-2022 school year.
- 2. Families who commit to the DEC for their children will receive follow-up communication from HCPSS staff later in May.
