Mt. Hebron High School is a community school with a reputation for excellence in academic achievement, athletics, and the performing arts. The vision of the Mt. Hebron High School community is to embrace diversity and possess the skills, knowledge and confidence to positively influence the larger community.

Mt. Hebron High School is consistently recognized for its academic excellence, college preparatory programs and strong, dedicated teachers. US News & World Report ranked Mt. Hebron High school as #18 among Maryland High Schools. Niche.com lists Mt. Hebron as the #10 Best Public High School in Maryland, #13 Best College Prep Public High School in Maryland, and #21 Best Public High School Teachers in Maryland of 217 Public High Schools. The school offers a rigorous academic program that includes 30 Advanced Placement courses in core academic subjects and elective disciplines. In 2018, Mt. Hebron students took 1126 exams with 87 percent of those test takers earning a qualifying score of 3 or higher. A score of 3, 4, or 5 is a predictor of success at a college level. Mt. Hebron enjoys a 98.4 percent graduation rate.

Mt. Hebron offers an array of programs to meet the needs of our culturally diverse student population. The Gifted and Talented Mentor Program allows students to pursue special interests through independent research and mentorships. Programs are in place to support students through special education services. Mt. Hebron provides academic tutorial support through the Beyond School Hours Program. The school has a dynamic program for English Speakers of Other Languages. Students who have additional individual needs are supported in an alternative learning program, Pathways to Success.

Mt. Hebron is proud of its tradition in extracurricular and co-curricular activities. There are over 92 clubs and a full range of extracurricular activities under the direction of an Athletics and Activities Manager. These include an award winning marching unit and cavaliers, a champion lancers team, first robotics, mock trial, and speech and debate.
