OVERVIEW

Howard County, Maryland is a suburban community of over 300,000 people situated midway along the Baltimore-Washington corridor. It is a county of contrasts — a blend of old and new, urban and rural, historical and progressive. The county's borders encompass Ellicott City, one of the country's oldest towns, and Columbia, a planned community conceived and designed 50 years ago. Howard County Public Schools consistently ranks among Maryland's top school districts based on student performance on state assessments as well as above the national averages on standardized tests. All Howard County public high schools are consistently ranked among the region's and the country's best high schools by the Washington Post and Newsweek. The system includes 13 comprehensive high schools, 20 middle schools, and 42 elementary schools, and 3 education centers serving approximately 60,000 students.

CURRICULUM AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

SCHEDULE:

HCPSS high schools operate on a full year schedule allowing students to earn up to 7 credits per year. Students may earn additional credits outside HCPSS by taking approved non-traditional sources of credit.

The Howard County Public School System computes both a weighted and unweighted GPA for each senior. Both are determined at the beginning of the senior year (October) and include all courses completed through junior year. The un-weighted GPA is computed by counting all courses equally on a 4.0 scale. The weighted GPA is computed by weighting Advanced Placement (AP), Gifted and Talented (GT), and Honors courses in which a student earns an A, B or C. In AP and GT courses, students will earn the weighted designation of 1.0 additional quality points. In Honors courses, students will earn the weighted designation of .5 quality points.
