Student participation in the advanced placement program and National Merit recognition also place our school among the top high schools in the nation. The student population is culturally diverse with a majority of the students enrolled in college preparatory, STEM, world language, and fine arts courses. RHHS participates in the JumpStart partnership between HCPSS and HCC, which offers students the opportunity to earn credits for graduation as well as college credits in English, mathematics, history, business, world language and education.

School improvement is an ongoing commitment to the Strategic Call to Action and the overarching commitments (value, achieve, connect, and empower) are at the core of school improvement. RHHS focuses its core values on Hawk PRIDE: Persistence and Passion, Respect and Responsibility, Innovation and Integrity, Determination and Dedication, and Excellence and Empathy for Everyone.
